

2026 FIRST HALF IMPACT REPORT



PLANNED PETHOOD OF GEORGIA, 501(C)(3)

With donor support, we work to keep dogs and cats healthy, families together, animals out of shelters, and prevent suffering before it starts.



Total Impact: In the first half of 2026, we served **9,505 cats and dogs**, an incredible 65% increase over the first half of 2025. This included pets, community cats, and shelter animals.

TNVR - COMMUNITY CATS

We expanded Trap - Neuter - Vaccinate - Return (TNVR) surgery slots from 1 to 3 days per week, and completed **581 surgeries from Jan to June**, a 108% increase over 2025.



ADOPTIONS

We rescued **186 at-risk cats and kittens**, provided medical care and foster homes, then matched each with a loving adopter, including 87 pet cats and 99 barn cats.

LOW COST SPAY/NEUTER

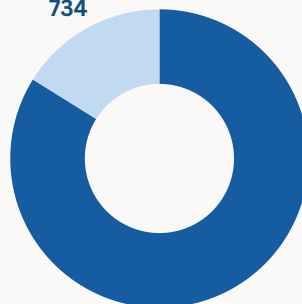
In the first half of 2026, we completed **4,554 spay/neuter surgeries**—nearly double the 2025 total of 2,400.

Our FIDO mobile clinic, launched in February, contributed **734 of the 4,554 surgeries**, increasing surgical capacity by 16%.

Moving into the second half of 2026, Planned PETHood has **4, highly skilled, full time veterinarians on staff**.

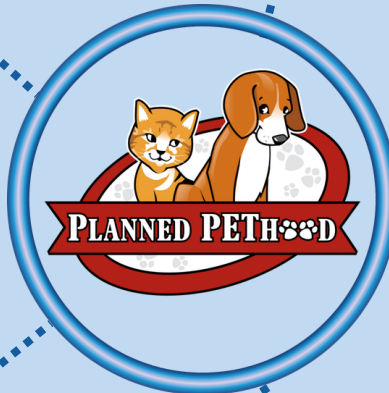
